

We spend a couple days in **Dublin, Ireland** in the elegant Hotel Davenport


















We embark on

Each room has replicas of how the rooms were used in the 17th Century.




We dock at **Douglas,** on the **Isle of Man**. Our tour includes the Castle Rushen.













From Castletown, we board a real steam train, taking us back to Douglas.




The next port was


Portrush, Scotland.

Derry-Londonderry.
















Next stop

But it gives us an extra day at FRINGE!








A powerful one-woman play.
