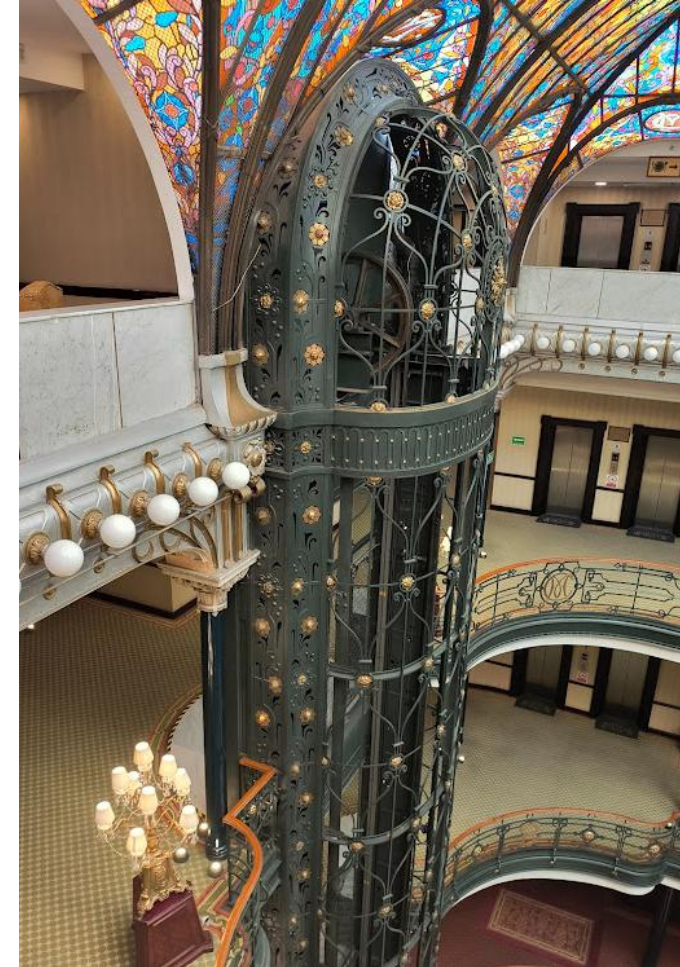

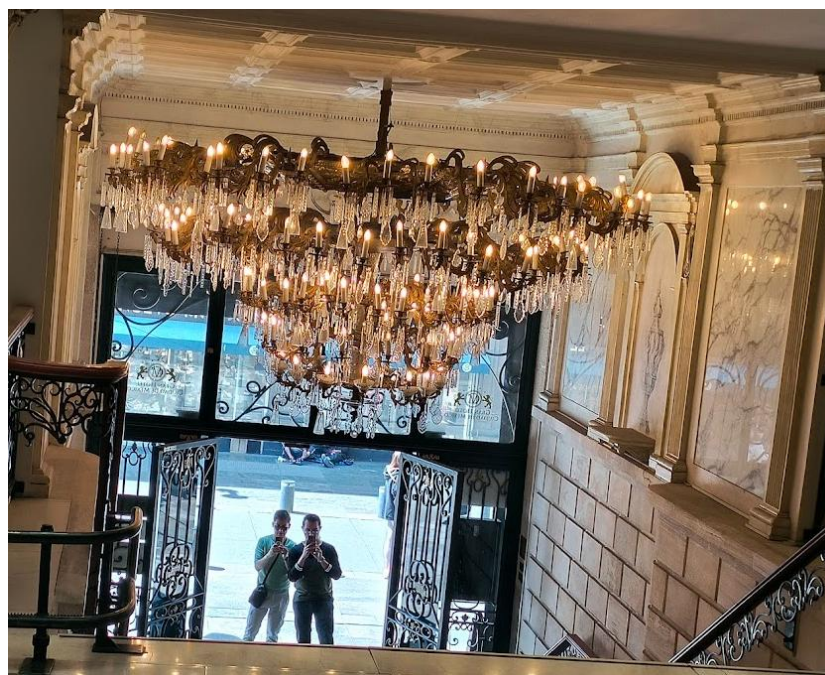

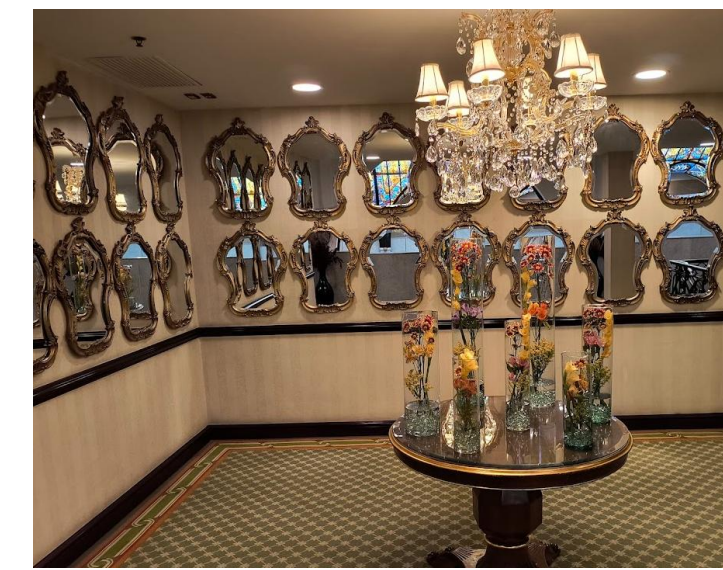




These charming porters were a big help with whatever we needed.



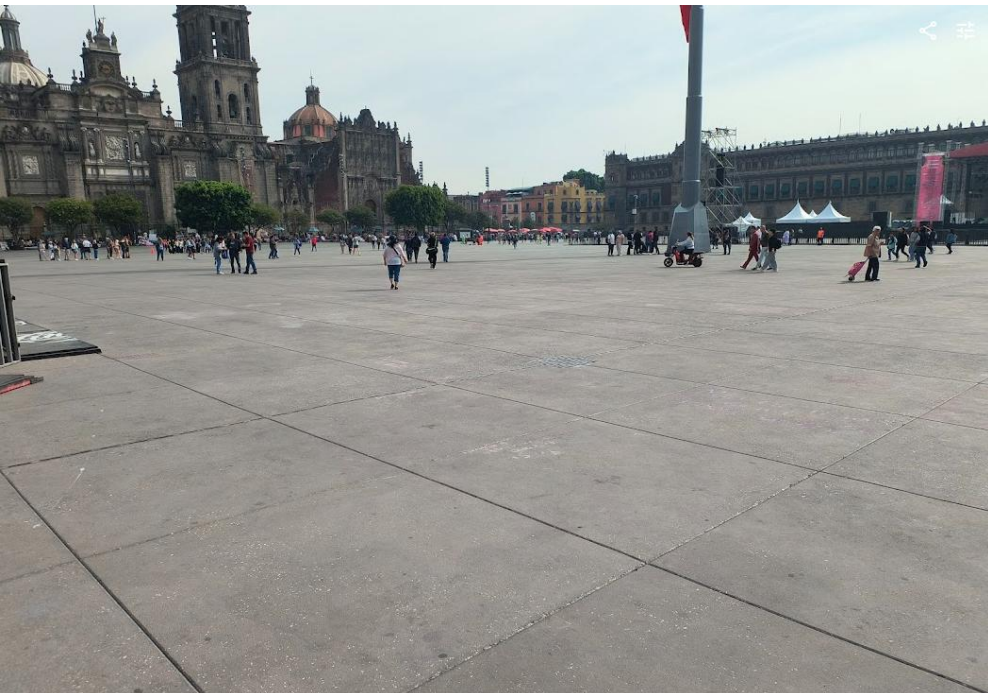
Our stay was enormously enhanced by staying in the beautiful **GRAND HOTEL** on the Zocalo.







The Zocalo was a constant source of entertainment. Every day something new was going on. Often **VERY LOUD!**



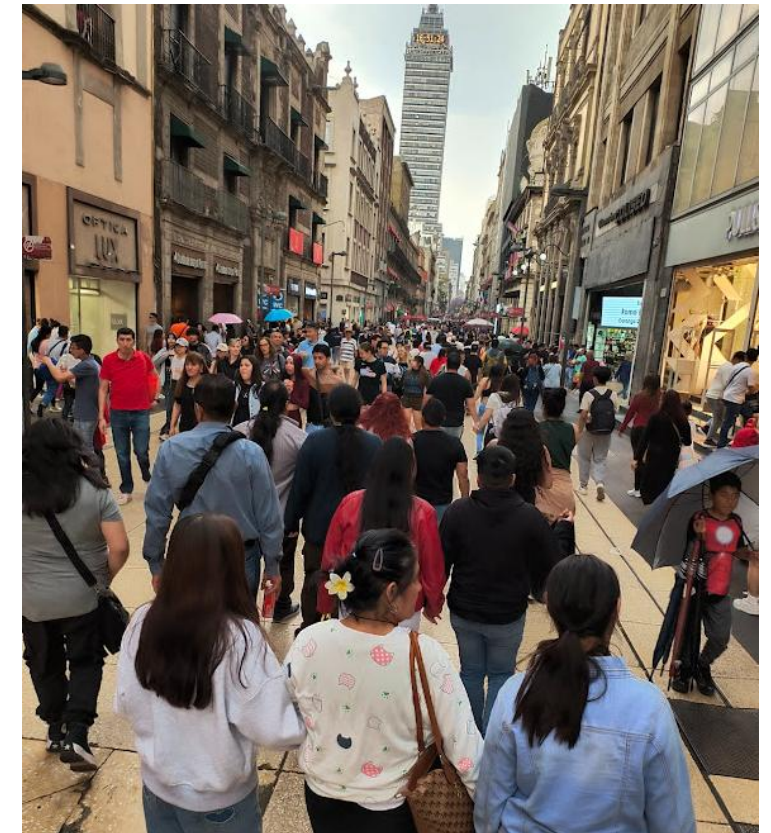




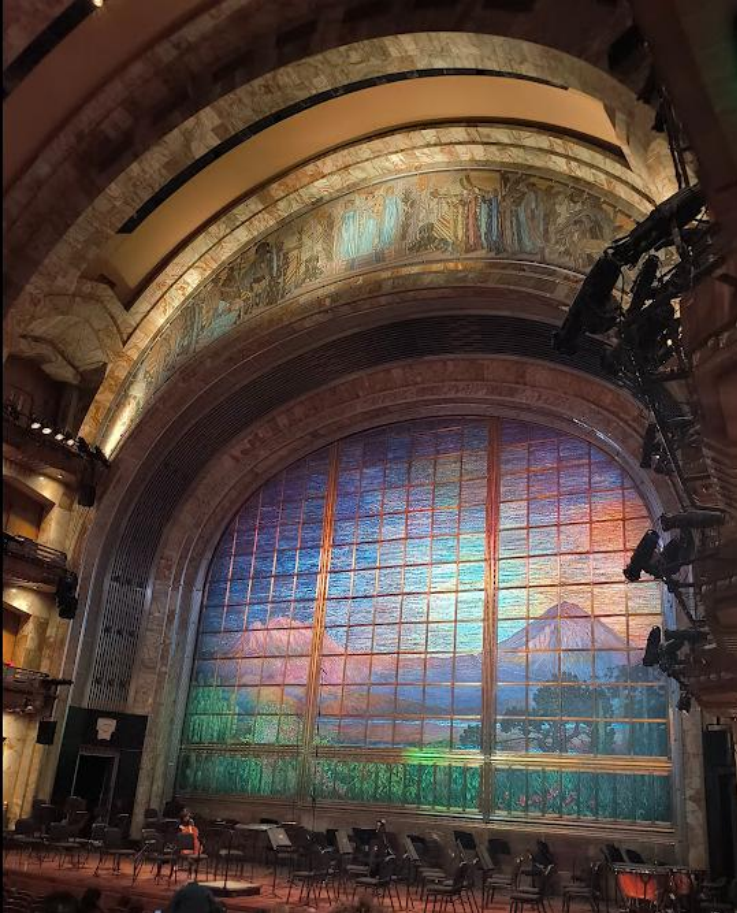
These are collapsible stools. We really wanted to buy one, but we weren't able to.

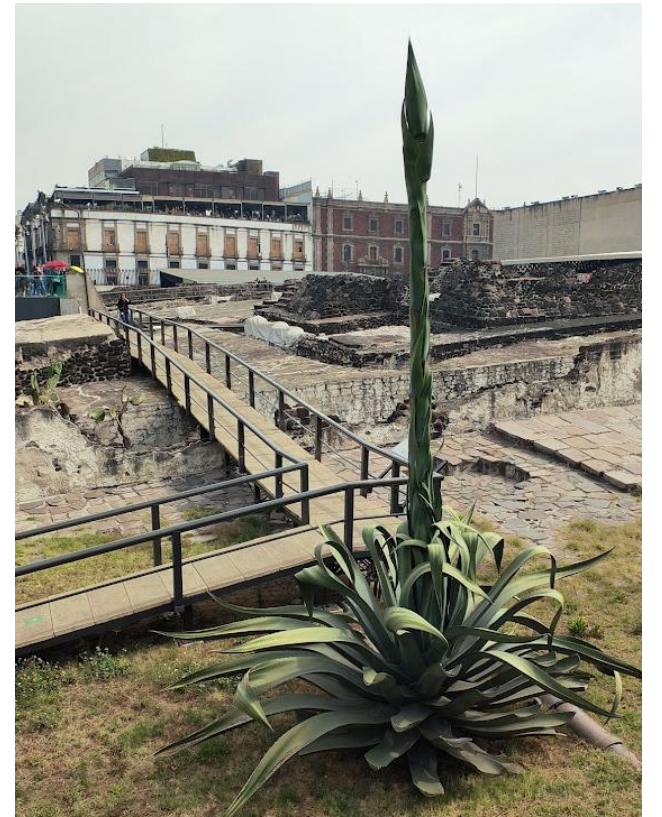
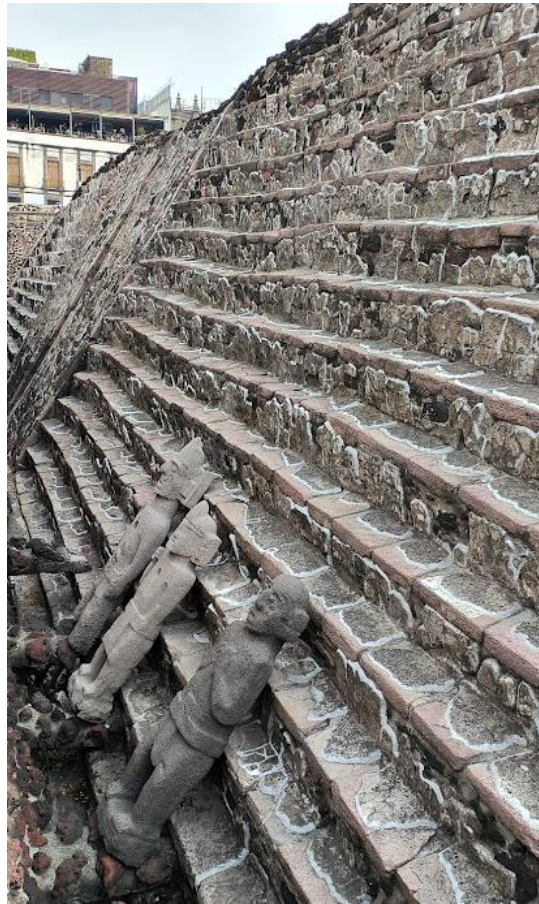
On our first night we went to this concert at the **Palacio de Bellas Artes**, featuring a fabulous guitarist.



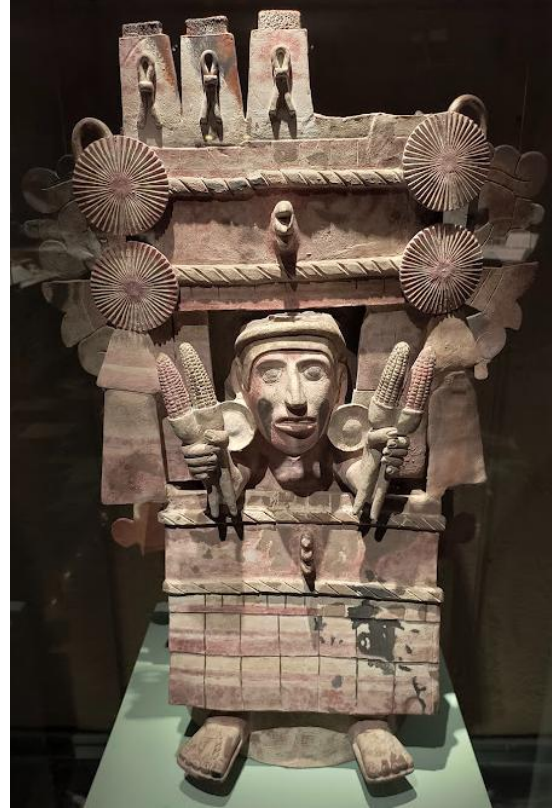




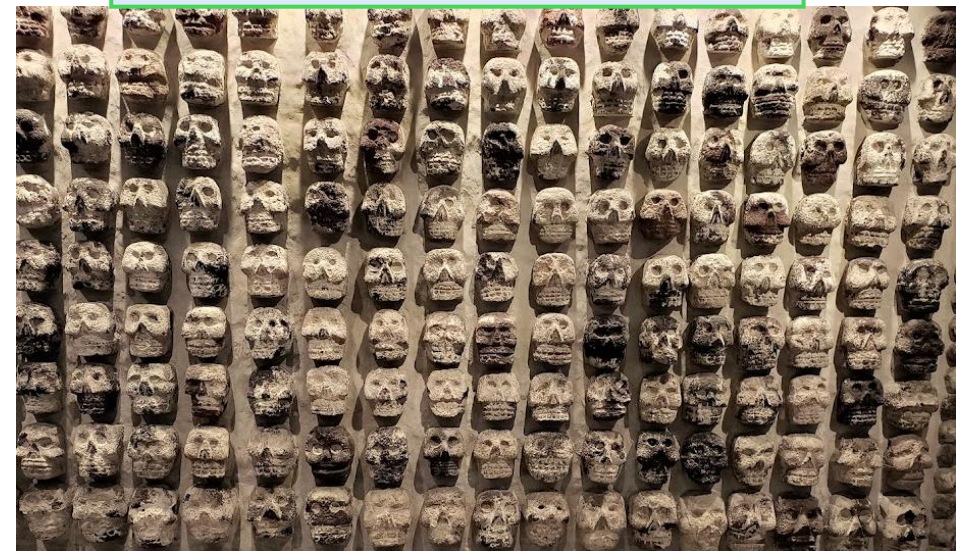

The Archeological Museum attached to the Mayan Ruins.



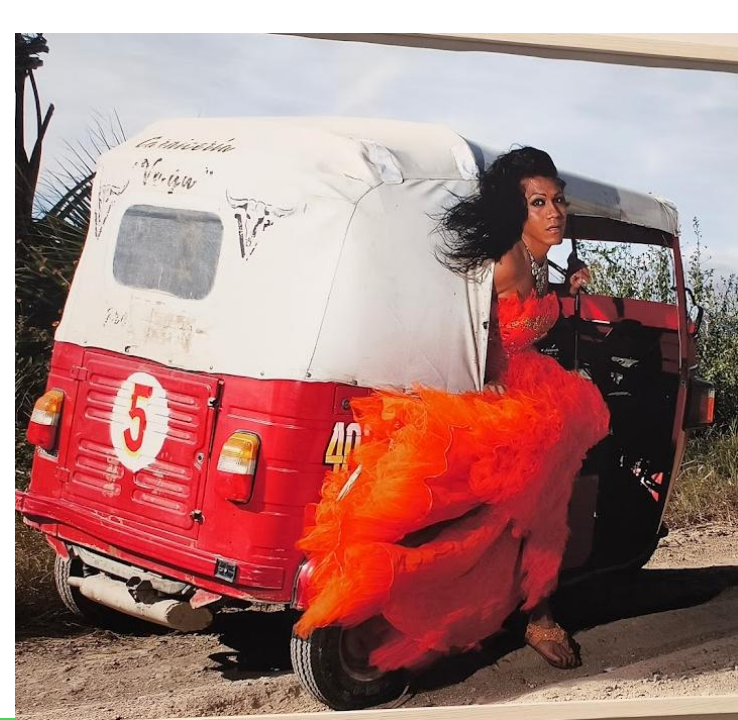




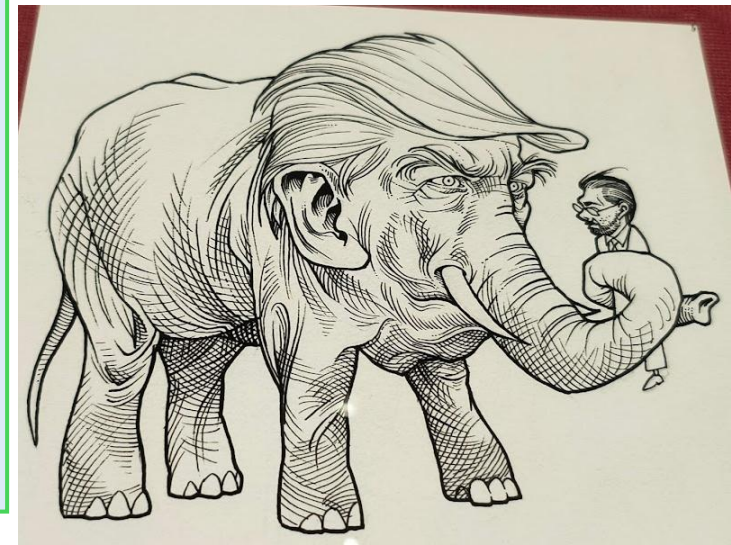
Back to the Palacio de Bellas Artes, for the Ballet Folklórico de Mexico





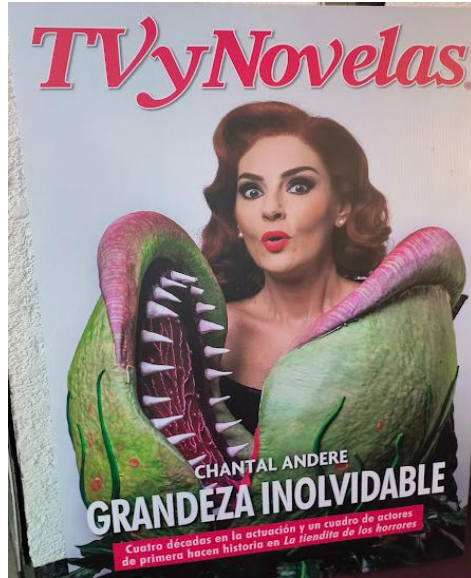


An Art Museum where the best works were photographs and cartoons.

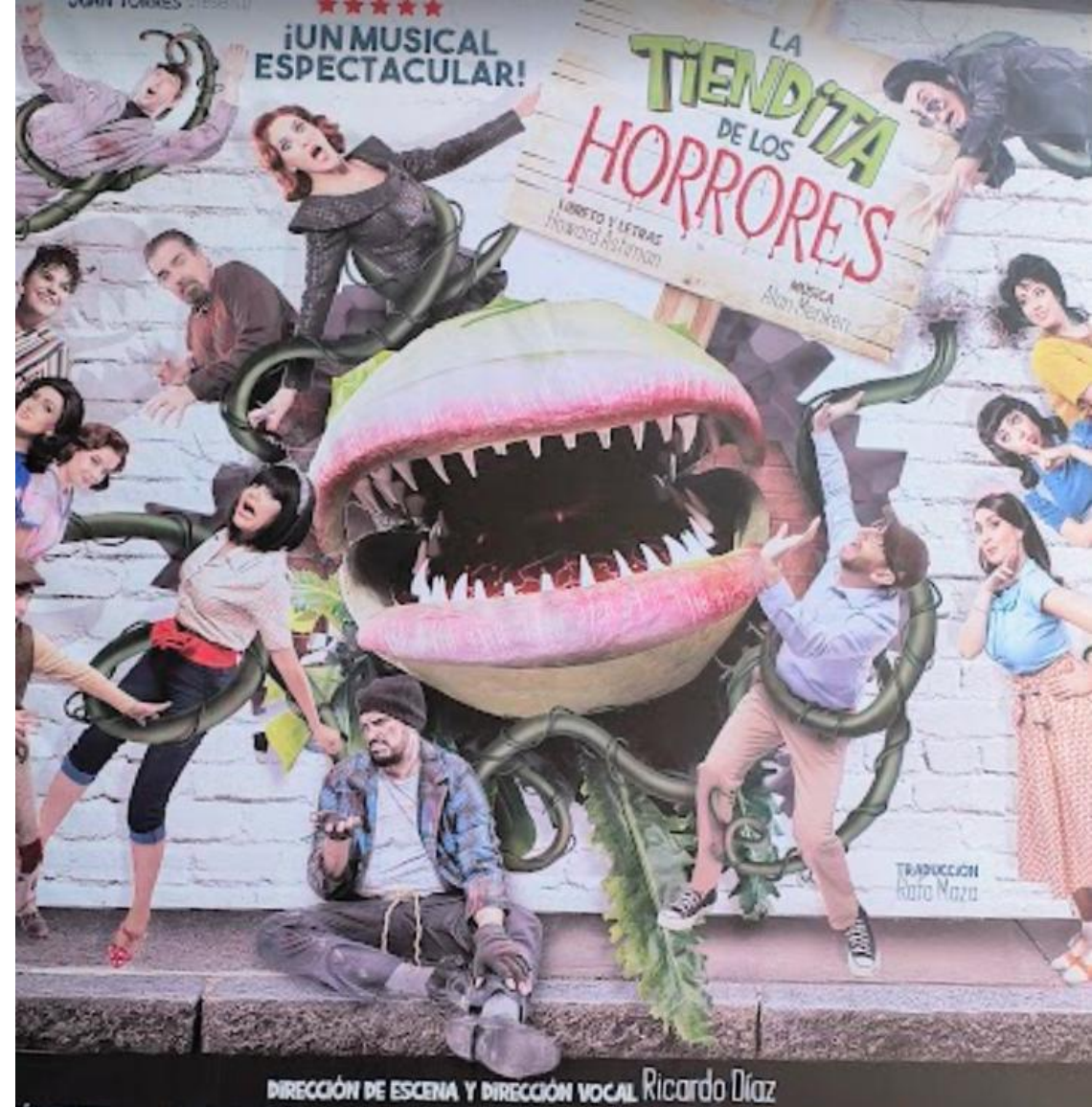




Audrey was played by a Telenova star, and her fans were in the audience.
