Then we were bused to The Nairobi National Park.


We were emphatically told that these were Baboons, not Monkeys


























We had a terrific lunch at Carnivore Restaurant where exotic meats were carved onto our plates.

From our hotel we took a sunset river cruise on the Zambezi River.











The next day started with a 3 ½ hour walk along Victoria Falls Park

We all got to feed the elephant, which was great! We put pellets in his trunk, and he snorted them in his mouth.








Moving to a beautiful lodge in Botswana, we take another river cruise on the Chobe River.

art galleries and fine restaurants.














Next a long drive down the Western side of the Cape, to The Cape of Good Hope.

The mountainous scenery was spectacular!














Then on the ride back up the Eastern coast we were stopped by a family of baboons. Finally, we reached our last destination,




